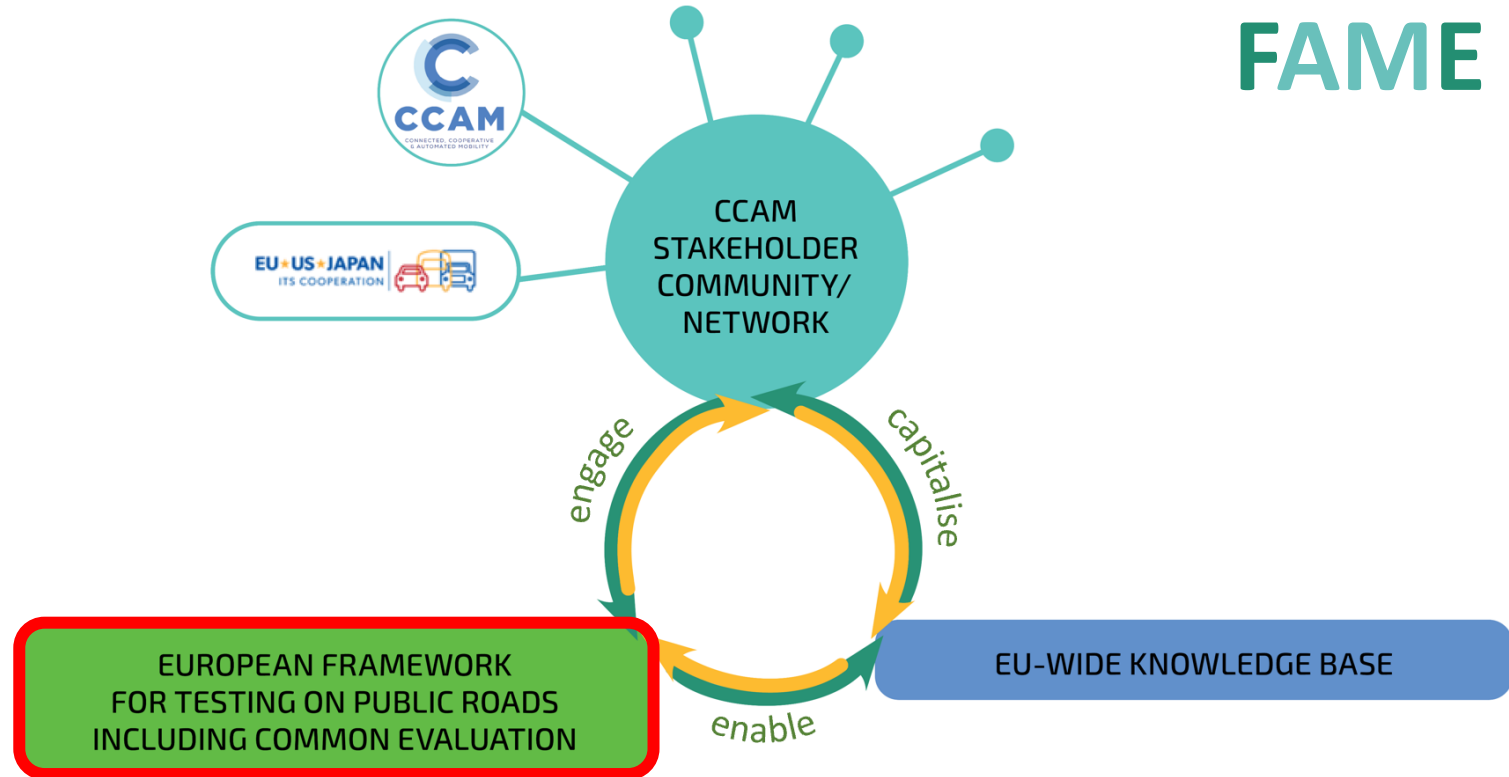

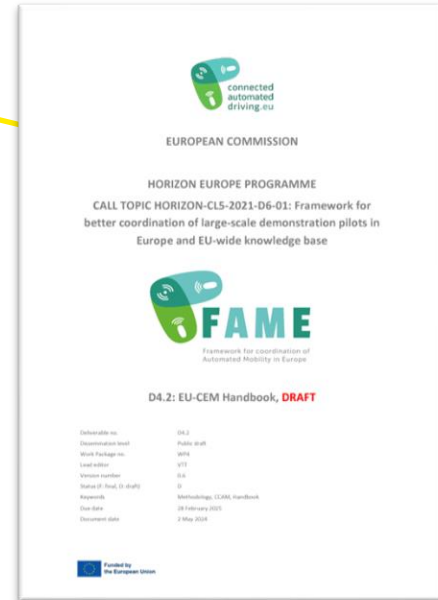

Common Evaluation Methodology for CCAM (EU-CEM)

- ▶ The EU-CEM Handbook provides guidance **on how to set up and carry out an evaluation or assessment** of direct and indirect (wider socio-economic) impacts of CCAM
- ▶ EU-CEM will be part of **European framework for testing [of CCAM] on public roads**
- ▶ **Objectives for EU-CEM**
 - Provide **common language and basis** for CCAM evaluations
 - Share **lessons learned and best practices**
 - **Better excellence and progress** of research and innovation on CCAM
 - Projects can provide **high quality input for decision and policy making**
- ▶ **Draft EU-CEM handbook** available in the [Knowledge base](#)
- ▶ **Final version will be published by June 2025**



Use of EU-CEM in Member states

► Impact assessment following the guidance of the EU-CEM can be a tool to estimate the **contribution of CCAM to policy goals**, how to maximise the positive effects of CCAM and to mitigate the potential weaknesses

→ **18 evaluation areas** included in the current draft of EU-CEM, addressing impacts on single vehicle or human level, on the level of traffic and transport and on the level or society

► EU-CEM is applicable to **all CCAM use cases**, in big and small projects – on **national, regional and local level**

► We welcome **feedback** on how well the draft handbook is applicable in national projects and how to enhance it to make it even better

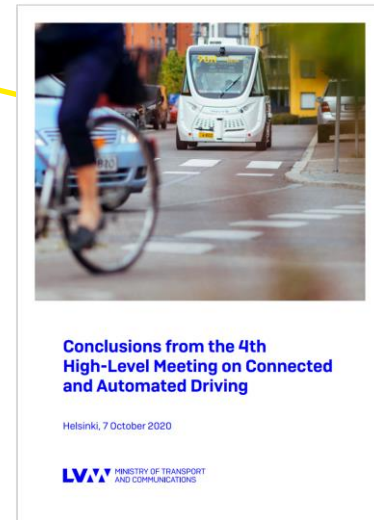


FAME Focus: Harmonized testing exemptions



CCAM Platform Final Report

“Harmonised conditions and processes for tests of CCAM systems on public roads, including criteria for a mutual recognition of procedures” for the topic of “Coordination of CCAM demonstrations in Europe”.



4th HLM on CAD Conclusions

...the means towards mutual recognition of testing authorisations should be developed. Moreover, some issues should be harmonised more in order to ease the testing of automated vehicles in different countries and to improve learning from the experiences of testing.

Need for common approach on testing frameworks

- ▶ FAME & SRG Workshop in February highlighted the **strong connection of the work** from the European Commission (MVWG) on pre-homologation testing and FAME / Hi-Drive on testing for R&D.
- ▶ **Some commonalities**, e.g. requirement for safety mechanisms (safety driver or remote safety operator) and handling of personal data. **A common taxonomy is needed**
- ▶ Proposal to combine the **Frameworks for open road testing permits for development and for type approval**, as the procedure can be shared, with **minor differences**
- ▶ Common objective to **facilitate overall deployment of CCAM** which requires **engagement from Member States**
